

Livescribe Smartpen

Read this before plugging in your Smartpen!

Step 1: What can I do with this thing?

Step 2: Install Livescribe desktop and plug in Smartpen

1. Open up a browser and go to livescribe website

Select your operating system (Windows or MAC) and install Livescribe desktop

2. If a dialog box appears Click on the button Name and Transfer

The name is on the back on the smartpen, either UAFChem1 or UAFChem2

3. If there are any updates, please click Download and Install

Step 3: Record using smartpen

1. Watch the tutorial video for getting started with the Echo pen.
2. Turn pen on, tap record on dot paper to start recording what you're writing and saying
3. Tap pause to stop recording for a moment and tap record to resume the same recording
4. Tap stop to end the recording when you are really done

Step 4: Download your recording to your computer and making pdf to share

1. Connect your livescribe pen to your computer and download recordings to livescribe desktop
2. Right click on thumbnail of recording you want to save as a pdf and send to pdf
3. Save pdf to desired location and rename

Step 5: Record a pencast of your exam (or whatever)

1. Print dot paper notebook pages
In livescribe desktop: tools → print your own notebook
2. Print your exam (or whatever) on dot paper AND save your exam as a pdf file
3. Work exam normally using the smartpen (step 4)
4. Download recording from the smartpen to your computer
The exam you printed on the dotpaper will not appear!
5. Save your pencast as a pdf (step 5)
6. Add your exam pdf as a watermark in Adobe Acrobat
 - a. Open your pencast in Adobe
 - b. Click on tools (upper right corner) → under edit page design, click watermark → add watermark
 - c. Under source, select file and load your pdf exam file;
under appearance, click scale relative to target page 100%
 - d. Your exam page should now appear behind the written text
 - e. Save pdf
